Round 1 on Friday and Round 3 on Saturday will begin promptly at 9:00 AM and will last between 1 and 2 ½ hours.



Round 2 on Friday and Round 4 on Saturday will begin promptly at 2:00 PM and will last between 1 and 2 ½ hours. Your team *may* be competing on the opposite side of the case in the afternoons: that is, if you were the prosecution in the morning, you *may* switch to the defense for the afternoon Round. Please refer to Rule 5.6 for more information.

There will be a break for lunch *on your own* between Rounds 1 and 2 and between rounds 3 and 4.

Your team will be assigned a team code before competition. Your team can ONLY be identified by the team code during competition.

When will we know who is advancing to the State Finals?

- The top three teams will be announced at the banquets on Saturday February 22 at the Albuquerque Convention Center and the Las Cruces Convention Center.
- The 1st place team (4-0 record) from each qualifier will automatically advance. The remaining six spots will be announced Monday February 24 via E-mail, Facebook and Twitter.

Opening Statement

Explained, not argued Provided a case overview Described case theme/theory Discussed witnesses & their testimony

Stated the relief requested Noted burden of proof Used notes minimally or not at all Stayed within time limit

Direct & Cross Examination

Did not overuse objections Asked questions in appropriate form Did not invite unfair extrapolations Handled physical evidence appropriately & effectively Observed proper courtroom decorum Showed understanding of issues, facts, law & rules

Used case theme/theory appropriately & effectively

Used & responded to objections appropriately & effectively

Witness Presentation

Observed appropriate courtroom decorum Showed understanding of the facts of the case Portrayed character credibly Sounded spontaneous, not memorized Had no notes Was poised Did not extrapolate unfairly

Avoided unnecessarily long and/or nonresponsive answers on cross examination

Closing Argument

Continued case theme/theory Summarized evidence Emphasized points that support own case or damage opponent's case Concentrated on the important, not the trivial

Argued applicable law Discussed burden of proof Presented argument persuasively Relied on notes minimally Stayed within time limit





Teacher Suggestions

- Determine Your Objectives
 - What do you want your students to learn from mock trial?
 - What values do you want to instill in your students?
 - Most students will not go on to be attorneys.
 - Are your objectives in line with your attorney coach? If not, let your attorney coach know what YOUR objectives are.



Teacher Suggestions

- Make a timeline
 - When should your students know the rules?
 - When should they be able to make an objection or argue an objection?
 - When are the directs etc. to be done?

LEGAL AUTHORITIES



Statute

30-2-1. Murder

A. Murder in the first degree is the killing of one human being by another without lawful justification or excuse, by any of the means with which death may be caused:

(1) by any kind of willful, deliberate and premeditated killing;

(2) in the commission of or attempt to commit any felony; or

(3) by any act greatly dangerous to the lives of others, indicating a depraved mind regardless of human life.

Whoever commits murder in the first degree is guilty of a capital felony.
